September Program "Our Local History, The McCandless/Northern Allegheny Heritage Center"

Many know the history of the Pittsburgh area's titans of industry, cultural phenomenons and medical innovations. But do you know the history of how the neighborhoods you live in came to be?

The mission of the establishment of the McCandless/Northern Allegheny Heritage Center in 2017, was to bring you stories of regular life and how the North Hills of Pittsburgh developed from farm land to a thriving suburban community.

In 2014, the Town of McCandless and the North Allegheny School District launched a collaborative effort to house the longtime collection of local history buff Joseph Bullick. Since the inception of the partnership, the community has shown an outpouring of support. Contributing community members have donated countless hours and materials for the careful planning of this project, which will benefit generations to come.

The groundbreaking ceremony was held on Community Day, September 13, 2014. Two years later, a sneak preview of the exhibits was held during Community Day, September 10, 2016.

The **2022 United States elections** will be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2022. During this midterm election year, all 435 seats in the House of

<u>Representatives</u> and 35 of the 100 seats in the <u>Senate</u> will be contested. Thirty-nine state and territorial <u>gubernatorial</u> and numerous other state and local elections will also be contested. This will be the first election affected by the <u>redistricting</u> that followed the <u>2020 census</u>.

Lunch Bunch




Morning Book Group


