

In a small North Carolina town where tobacco is king, a teenage girl discovers a dark secret that she grapples with exposing.



Update from National

Summer of Action: Marching for Equality, Fighting for Change

Summer has been so full of activity and it's always hard to believe how quickly "back to school" comes upon us! The prep has already begun, to move into the New Year with the AAUW program year for National and affiliates.

Below are some moments to share from the last several months, which was a particularly eventful one – and a quick preview of things to come.

On July 27, the AAUW Lobby Corps was back on Capitol Hill for the first time in-person since 2019! Kudos to Meghan Kissell and the policy team for preparing our dedicated local AAUW members to continue to advocate for our policy priorities.

That same day was Black Women's Equal Pay Day, which calls attention to how Black women working full-time, year-round, are paid only *67 cents* for every dollar paid to non-Hispanic white men.

We marked Moms' Equal Pay Day, on August 15. What a shame that we still need to mark these days—but we are making (*slow*) progress in the fight to eliminate them.

August 1 was a much happier day—one of my favorites of the year—the opening of AAUW Fellowships & Grants application season! <u>AAUW is now welcoming applications for all of our fellowships and grants programs</u>.

And looking to the weeks ahead, AAUW is so proud to be a partner with the <u>March on Washington</u>, taking place on August 26 which continues the original 1963 March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom.

We will also lift up Women's Equality Day on August 26, which commemorates the passage of the 19th Amendment in 1920, giving women the right to vote—



The Convention of the Elimination of all forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) – Cites for CEDAW Pittsburgh Update

In 2016 the City of Pittsburgh unanimously passed the Gender Equity Ordinance Chapter 177C:-Gender Equity Commission with the requirement to hire an Executive Director to lead a newly created intersectional Gender Equity Commission (GEC). AAUW North Hills Pittsburgh under the leadership of Peggy Schmiedecke has served on the Cities for CEDAW Pittsburgh and Allegheny County since 2015.

Key points from the May 2015 letter to Edward C. Gainey, Mayor of The City of Pittsburgh

Since 2020, government funding and support for the commission has steadily decreased, rendering the commission virtually ineffective. Under the leadership of The Honorable Edward C. Gainey, Mayor of The City of Pittsburgh. AAUW North Hills Pittsburgh partnered in May 2023 with (@) Cities for CEDAW Pittsburgh, and over 20 other organizations to formally request that funding be restored to the Gender Equity Commission and that an Executive Director be hired immediately.

The GEC must be rebuilt to continue its work in the areas of

- Economic Development, including pay equity, affordable housing and transportation
- Violence Against Women and Girls
- Education, including pre-school childcare, early childhood education, afterschool, and summer programs for older children
- Delivery of City Services

The failure of the City of Pittsburgh to hire an Executive Director to lead the GEC or appoint Gender Equity Commissioners for over a year after the current administration took office is alarming. This failure to act jeopardizes the Commission and its goals around intersectional gender equity in our city. CEDAW for Pittsburgh requested that the City of Pittsburgh adhere to the Gender Equity Ordinance and take immediate and meaningful action to hire an Executive Director for the GEC.

Pittsburgh City Council Meeting 6/27/2023



Marcia Bandes, Chairwoman for the Pittsburgh for CEDAW Coalition spoke and shared the status of Gender Equity Commission of the past year and half and requested the support of City Council. The intersectional Gender Equity Commission (GEC), to be led by an Executive Director, was created after a city ordinance was passed unanimously in December 2016. There were only 4 members that remained to hear the public comments. Marcia left after the public comment section and was unable to speak with any of the council members. Marcia did see mayor Gainey in the hall coming from a different meeting and asked if he had seen the letter and he said he

had not, but would look for it. Marcia did ask for a meeting.

Women's Equality Day

Women's Equality Day is celebrated in the United States on August 26 to commemorate the 1920 adoption of the Nineteenth Amendment (Amendment XIX) to the United States Constitution, which prohibits the states and the federal government from denying the right to vote to citizens of the United States on the basis of sex. It was first celebrated in 1971, designated by Congress in 1973, and is proclaimed each year by the United States President.



The date was chosen to commemorate the day in 1920 when the Secretary of State Bainbridge Colby signed the proclamation granting American women the constitutional right to vote. [1] In 1971, following the 1970 nationwide Women's Strike for Equality, and again in 1973, as the battles over the Equal Rights Amendment continued, Congresswoman Bella Abzug of New York introduced a resolution to designate August 26 as Women's Equality Day.

In 1972, President Richard Nixon issued Proclamation 4147, which designated August 26, 1972, as "Women's Rights Day" and was the first official proclamation of Women's Equality Day. [4] On August 16, 1973, Congress approved H.J. Res. 52, which stated that August 26 would be designated as Women's Equality Day and that "the President is authorized and requested to issue a proclamation in commemoration of that day in 1920 on which the women in America were first guaranteed the right to vote". [5] The same day, President Nixon issued Proclamation 4236 for Women's Equality Day, which began, in part: "The struggle for women's suffrage, however, was only the first step toward full and equal participation of women in our Nation's life. In recent years, we have made other giant strides by attacking sex discrimination through our laws and by paving new avenues to equal economic opportunity for women. Today, in virtually every sector of our society, women are making important contributions to the quality of American life.



Road Trip - Fall Foliage Boat Tour

Do you enjoy looking at the fall foliage? Come and take a ride on Preston's Pearl, an enclosed pontoon boat at Moraine State Park. The boat has an enclosed first floor and a second-floor open air deck. Enjoy learning about the area's natural history and osprey reintroduction, while appreciating the unique scenery and wildlife on an exciting trip around Lake Arthur.

Preston's Pearl boards at the McDanels Boat Launch, adjacent to the Gift Shop. Preston's Pearl is handicap accessible. There are limited bathroom facilities onboard, so early arrival is suggested to allow use of modern restroom facilities.

We are exploring Privately Chartering the boat for a one-hour cruise. We need at least 20 people to be interested in this event. Cost would be between \$15-20 per person depending on the number of people. This Charter Cruise can accommodate up to 40 people so bring a friend. If we do this it will be a week day in October. Once I see if there is interest, I will work on a date and time.


